
Theme – Rainbows

- Match uppercase and lowercase letters T -t

Games to play


Sensory – Rainbow Rice

Materials

- Rice
- Food coloring
- Vinegar
- Various tools to play with

Set out containers of rice, add different food colouring and vinegar to each container until rice is covered, leave to dry.





Movement - Colour Exercises

- Find a safe space outside your house to complete these activities.
- Each colour should represent a type of exercise or movement e.g red means run, yellow means dance, blue means swim etc.
- Call out a range of different colours and get your child to move to them accordingly.
- You can use coloured card and pictures to help children remember which action is for which colour.
