Operation of Seven Towers Leisure Centre car park during road works

The Department for Infrastructure and their contractor need to close the existing access to Castle Tower School, Ballymena Nursery School, and Seven Towers Leisure Centre car park for approximately 3 months from **Wednesday 31st August 2022** to facilitate the construction of the new St. Patrick's Regeneration Link Road.

Mid & East Antrim Borough Council have kindly agreed to facilitate access to Castle Tower School and Ballymena Nursery School through the car park via a temporary access from Trostan Avenue. During this period the car park will be busier than normal, especially at school drop off and pickup times. People using the car park are asked to be patient and particularly careful of the increased number of young children in the area and to follow the directions below:

- Drive carefully and adhere to the speed limit.
- Follow the one way system.
- Keep the main route clear – parking only in spaces provided.
- Be respectful of disabled parking bays in the car park and those spaces reserved for staff of Ballymena Nursery School.

We will monitor the new layout to ensure that it operates satisfactorily and are committed to continue to work with Mid & East Antrim Borough Council and the schools to ensure any disruption is minimised as much as possible.

On completion of works access to Castle Tower School and the car park will be provided from the newly constructed road. The Department apologises for any disruption caused and can assure you that our project team is working hard to deliver the new link road for the benefit of the local community.
